



Social / Community Group Involvement




Among those not involved in each type, there is still some interest in joining many faith-based communities.






New Findings





Respondent Segmentation




The "stronger" and Middling segments are more likely to be involved in faith groups. Slightly more of the "weak" segments are not involved in any group.

Social / Community Group Involvement




The Weak Aspiring are less likely to be interested in groups. All cite time as a barrier.

Extremely Interested in Making Faith Connections with Others in Any Geography











Social / Community Group Frequency: Weekly




Those who participate in faith groups look forward to participating more than those who participate in other groups.

Social / Community Group: Look Forward to Participating "A Great Deal"




Top responses for "Group Name" in each community category











